


WORLD BOOK DAY






AUTISM AWARENESS WEEK






EINSTEIN CLASS



COLUMBUS CLASS



In Columbus class, our students have been working extremely hard this term (as per usual), in both their academic and practical subjects.

In January, the majority of Columbus students experienced their first round of real Functional Skills English and Maths exams for this academic year. The results are looking really positive, and their hard work has paid off. This means Columbus students are ready for the next challenge and can move on to the next level of English and Maths.

In English, Columbus have been learning what a biography is, and using their favourite celebrities as examples to explore this topic. In Maths, Entry Level students have been learning how to apply basic number skills to word problems and real life situations. Meanwhile, our Level 1 and Level 2 students are learning how to use and apply percentages with real world applications such as VAT and retail discounts.

In Science, the class have been working on researching chemistry in our world and exploring elements. The year 9's and the year 10's took part in experiments to explore the topic.

In our more practical subjects, e.g. cooking, Columbus class have developed their independence with following a recipe from the internet step by step to help them to cook simple meals. For example, some of the meals Columbus have made include: fish cake, pancake, ginger cake and flapjacks.

In PE, the class have been taking part in a variety of multi-sports, for example football, basketball, dodgeball and boxing.













RASHFORD CLASS



Rashford class have enjoyed Trampolining this term. It has been full of fun and exercise. It has also been part of our enrichment programme, which resulted in learning to do standard trampoline exercises and complex turns and swivels.


















SHAKESPEARE CLASS
