#### Dear Parent/Carer.

We have just finished the first full week and what a week it has been. We are setting high standards for uniform this term and students are getting the message that non-compliance has consequences. I want you to feel that you will be listened to, and more importantly heard, if you have an issue, however small you think it may be. Don't let things drift or fester, let us know so we can help.







# Attendance and the Law

Parents/carers commit an offence if a child does not attend school regularly and the absence is not agreed by the school (i.e. the absence is unauthorised).

Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 places a duty on parents to ensure that their child of compulsory school age receives a suitable education, either by regular attendance at school or otherwise.

A pupil's unauthorised absence from school could result in one of the following:

**Penalty Notice**: penalty notices may be issued to address absence including holidays taken during term time. The penalty is £80 payable (per parent, per child) within 21 days, rising to £160 if paid between 22 and 28 days. When a second penalty notice is imposed within a 3-year period, the fine is £160 (per parent, per child) A Penalty Notice is an alternative to prosecution; it does not require a court appearance, but still aims to improve school attendance. Failure to pay may result in prosecution.


**Prosecution:** under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996. Prosecution could result in a criminal record and fines up to £2500 and/or 3 months imprisonment. A range of other outcomes are also available such as Parenting Orders or Community Sentences.

At Cambridge School, our objective is to collaborate with parents proactively, well before any penalties are necessary, to ensure all our learners understand the value of education and attend school regularly.
